TRI Manages and Provides Technical, Logistical, and Communications Support to the USTDA Orientation Visit on Civil Aviation and Air Traffic Control for Brazilian Officials

Bethesda, Maryland – August 3-8, 2008 and September 21-26, 2008, TRI manages and provides technical, logistical, and communications support to the U.S. Trade Development Agency (USTDA) Orientation Visit on Civil Aviation and Air Traffic Control for Brazilian Officials. Brazil is home to one of the largest civil aircraft fleets in the world. A recent series of significant aviation failures, have laid bare conflicts between military and civil administration of air travel and labor issues in air traffic control. The Air Traffic Control Department of the Brazilian Air Force (DECEA) is the air traffic control authority, and the National Civil Aviation Agency (ANAC) is responsible for Brazil's civil aviation safety.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has devoted considerable effort and resources to working closely with the Brazilian government on ways in which the U.S. and Brazil can share information and best practices on civil aviation and air traffic control issues. In an effort to review and improve Brazil's civil aviation and air traffic control procedures, ANAC and DECEA have come to the U.S. to learn directly from their counterparts about the U.S. experience in safe air transportation standards and regulations.

The objectives of the Orientation Visits are to familiarize Brazilian aviation officials with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations and procedures governing civil aviation safety and air traffic control and to spur greater collaboration between DECEA and ANAC. TRI aids in the accomplishment of this objective by providing key Brazilian officials from DECEA and ANAC the opportunity to:

- View state-of-the-art air traffic control facilities that control some of the world's most congested airspace.
- Speak with and learn from researchers at the FAA Technical Center, the nation's aviation research and development, and test and evaluation facility.
- See how the FAA completes its mission and is organized from the ground-level.
